## Dorchester School District Two Procedure for Over –The- Counter (OTC) Medication

Your child may have over-the-counter medication at school (aspirin, Tylenol, cough syrup, etc.) per <u>Joint Advisory Opinion Issued by South Carolina Boards of Medical Examiners, Nursing and Pharmacy, Regarding OTC Medicine and Schools</u> by following ALL of the instructions below:

- Deliver the completed Dorchester School District Two medication permission form completed including the signature of the doctor or other legal prescriber.
- An unopen container of the OTC medication and properly labeled by the pharmacist. Your physician or legal prescriber will have to write a prescription for the OTC medication so you can present it to the pharmacist. (See picture of a properly labeled OTC medication below)
- Medication MUST be brought in by parent/legal guardian, NOT the student.
