## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Gregg Middle School, home of the Mustangs, is located in a suburban area of Summerville and is one of six middle schools in Dorchester District Two. Our students are afforded many opportunities for learning and being involved in school activities. Our curriculum includes gifted and talented, advanced, and special needs courses. We also offer high school credit courses including Algebra I, English I, Spanish I, Geometry, and Keyboarding/Computer Applications. In addition, we advocate strongly for the fine arts with courses in band, chorus, dance, steel drums, orchestra, guitar, piano, and visual arts. Fifty-eight highly qualified teachers serve approximately 1,130 students in Grades 6-8, along with 3 administrators, 3 guidance counselors, a media specialist, an instructional technology specialist, a full-time nurse and school psychologist. Our SIC, PTSA and business partners are strong and active supporters of our school working collaboratively with faculty and staff. Our vision is to provide a safe, structured learning environment to promote high expectations for student achievement and character development to encourage success. Gregg Middle School's motto, "Success is the ONLY Option," guides all that we do.

We are proud that GMS was again recognized as a Palmetto Gold Award winner for the 2012-2013 school year, recognizing our overall student achievement. Our students excelled in many academic, athletic, and artistic areas including Quest, Math Counts, Reflections, FLL Robotics, and the State Choral, Piano, and Band Festivals. Thirty-six seventh graders participated in Duke TIP with six students earning state recognition. Twenty-five eighth graders were also named SC Junior Scholars. Additionally, our baseball, softball, and girls' basketball teams earned district championship titles this school year.

We continue to focus on the academic and social needs of all students. Mustang Minutes is a mentoring program sponsored by all teachers for all students that focuses on academic goal setting. It is coupled with an interest club that the students choose. In addition, remediation classes are offered in reading and math for our struggling learners. Our teachers continue to concentrate on their professional development in an effort to provide rigorous and relevant instruction with nearly $50 \%$ having attained their gifted and talented endorsement.

Our students show their Mustang PRIDE (Prepared Responsible Individuals Determined to Excel) every day as part of our PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions \& Support) program. Students are rewarded for good behavior, good character, and good grades with Positive Pride referrals, quarterly incentives, and Gold ID cards, which earn them special privileges throughout the school year.

At Gregg Middle School, we motivate and encourage our students to achieve excellence in all that they do!
