OMS -Student ID Policies and Procedures 22-23

The ID center is in the Media Center.

1. IDs will always be worn around the neck while at school. IDs may not be kept in pockets or wallets, nor may they be worn around belts/belt loops.



- 2. IDs are an integral part of the safety of our school campus and community. It is imperative that students bring their ID to school each day. This is their responsibility. Students that ride the bus, you are required to wear your ID on the bus to and from school each day.
- 3. Students must use the initial issued lanyards/or they may purchase one from the school or elsewhere. Students are allowed to use an ID cover.
- 4. Only the permanent ID will hang on the lanyard. Students will not be allowed to hang keys or other personal items from the school-issued lanyard. (Students may use a personal lanyard if they have keys that must be worn.)
- 5. Students are not allowed to "decorate" draw or deface their IDs in any way. If they do, they will be issued and charged for new ID. In addition, students are not allowed to decorate or alter the school-issued lanyards except for specific, administrator approved purposes.
- 6. If at any point during the school day, a teacher sees a student without an ID, that student will be asked to put his/her ID back on. If the student has lost the ID, he/she will be issued and charged for a replacement ID (temporary IDs cost \$0.50, permanent IDs cost \$5.00, and lanyards cost \$1.00).
- 7. If a student needs a replacement ID, the first period teacher will submit a request via the link by 8:45 AM. The IDs will be delivered to class by 3rd period.
