

A Note about ROTC

- ROTC is an alternative to PE for high school requirements.
- Students who take ROTC will learn about Military drills, structure, ranking, etc.
- ROTC students wear a uniform to school one day a week.
- There are out of school activities and scholarships associated with ROTC that students can but are not obligated to participate in.

Retaking a High School Credit Course from Middle School

- O YES!! You CAN... should you?
- O If your grade is low and you didn't learn the content of the course.... Consider!
- A student who retakes a high school credit course from middle school must complete it before the next sequential course.
- If the course being retaken has an EOCEP, the EOCEP must be retaken.
- The student's transcript will reflect both courses. Only one course attempt and the <u>highest grade earned</u> for the course will be Calculated in the GPA! (That's a positive!)
