Students are not allowed to enter the classrooms prior to 6:50 due to lack of supervision. All car riders should be dropped off between 6:50 a.m. and 7:15 a.m. in the car rider loop behind Spann.

We are pleased to introduce a new service, Edulog Parent Portal Lite—a free smartphone app, that will give you information regarding the location and timing of your student's bus. We will also be able to com-

> municate information about your student's bus with you through the app. Be sure to download "Parent Portal Lite," not "Parent Portal." After you download the app, you'll need to:

<u>Sign up for an account</u>-you'll see a <u>sign up bar</u>.

Tap the "Districts" tab at the bottom of your screen.

Add your child's bus number

We hope you find these instructions helpful and that you will take advantage of this service to enhance your experience with the Dorchester District Two school bus system.

Students riding buses to school will exit buses in an orderly fashion and proceed on the sidewalks. If they are eating breakfast, they will enter the cafeteria and go directly to the breakfast line. Otherwise, students will go directly to their classroom. Do not enter/park in bus and day care van loading area (street in front, John McKissick Way) or the front driveway between 6:30-7:30 a.m. or 1:30-2:45 p.m. Do not park in handicapped spaces unless vehicle is properly identified.

<u>Safety Drill Procedures</u> - Throughout the school year, we conduct weather and emergency safety drills with our students and staff (fire, earthquake, tornado, intruder) to empower them with the knowledge of what to do in case of an emergency.


