Requirements to be Counted Present for the School Day

Students must attend school for 50% of the instructional day to be counted present.

Explanation/Clarification

The South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) states that a school year consists of 180 days of instruction. In Dorchester School District Two a day of instruction is 7 hours long. Students must be present for 3½ hours of instruction for the instructional day to count as one of the 180 days required by the SCDE. This includes "Early Release"



days. An "Early Release" day only consists of 3¾ hours of instruction. Therefore, even on the "Early Release" days a student needs to be present for 3½ hours of instruction to be counted present for the instructional day.
