We Need Your Help.... Test Monitors Needed!

Dorchester School District 2 requires that schools have monitors present in classrooms to assist during the administration of SCREADY and SCPASS. This policy was adopted on the recommendation of the state of South Carolina.

What are the responsibilities of a testing monitor?

- Monitors assist the testing administrator with distribution of paper, pencils, and other necessary materials.
- Monitors may escort students to the restroom or nurse, if needed.
- Monitors may be asked to assist the testing administrator with other duties

Are there any qualifications for a testing monitor?

Yes, all monitors are required to attend a short training on test security with the school's testing coordinator, Mrs. Canty. In this training you will learn a few important rules about what you can and cannot do as a monitor. The training will take about thirty minutes and will need to happen **prior** to your scheduled testing date.

The spring test window will span from May 10th -June 2nd. Please consider volunteering one or more days to help us out. Please contact the front office at **843-873-3050** if you are interested in volunteering to be a testing monitor.
