



College and Career Readiness



Dorchester School District Two believes that College and Career Readiness are one and the same. Because of this, we have to educate all students in a manner that promotes this belief.



This means providing students with opportunities and access to choose their own path while providing them the flexibility to change paths as needed to be competitive in the global society.



Earning Credits for College

Advanced Placement (AP)

- Advanced high school classes for college credit with high score on AP exam
- No cost to the student

Dual Credit

- Trident Tech classes for high school and college credit
- Cost to the student

Early College Program

- Trident Tech classes for high school and college credit
- Earn an Associate's degree while in high school
- No cost to the student

ECPI Program

- ECPI classes for high school and college credit
- Possible technical certifications
- No cost to the student



"The Early College Program (ECP) is a dual credit initiative between Dorchester School District Two and Trident Technical College. Students who are selected to enroll in the Early College Program understand that they are part of a rigorous, adult, collegiate environment. The students will be challenged daily and therefore must be committed to academic excellence."

What is Early College?

- Partnership between ARHS, DD2, and Trident Technical College
- ► Three-year program where students concurrently earn HS credits along with college credits
 - ► Earn High School Diploma
 - ► Earn College Associate Degree
- Program is free for students
- Special recruitment efforts will be targeted toward students who are academically exceptional yet traditionally underserved in college access
- Program eligibility requirements must be followed to maintain a spot



Participants



We will recruit a cohort of thirty 9th grade students. All first time ninth students are eligible to apply.



Students remain in their cohort through the program and follow a prescribed course sequencing.



The cohort promotes student collaboration and support.



College and Dual Enrollment Program Requirements

Students must earn qualifying SAT, ACT or TTC placement (Accuplacer) test scores for the course(s) in which they wish to enroll.

Students must submit a Dual Credit Application signed by the HS guidance counselor.

Students will earn <u>one unit</u> toward the high school diploma for each <u>three-semester hour</u> college course successfully completed.

Student performance in the college dual credit courses will directly affect the high school records and graduation requirements in accordance with the S.C. state policy.

This is a three-year program, <u>INCLUDING</u>
<u>SUMMERS</u>



Expectations

- ► This program is voluntary
- You will act as a mature young person regardless of the setting or classroom
- Students are treated as adults by TTC
- ► You are responsible for your education
 - ▶ Proactive
 - ► Time-management skills
 - ► Good study habits
- Upon acceptance you will sign an expectation code of conduct




Expectations

- Students must earn a B or better in all TTC and ARHS courses to stay in the program
- Academic probation policy in place



Students who successfully complete the ECP program graduate from Trident Technical College in May BEFORE they graduate from Ashley Ridge!




