## Promotion and Retention

## The policy:

- To go from $9^{\text {th }}$ to $10^{\text {th }}$ grade requires 6 credits which must include but are not limited to:
$\rightarrow$ English 1 credit
$\rightarrow$ Math 1 credit
Science 1 credit
- Additional Courses 3 credits
- To go from $10^{\text {th }}$ to $11^{\text {th }}$ grade requires 12 credits which must include but are not limited to:
$\rightarrow$ English 2 credits
- Math

- Social Studies 1 credit
$\rightarrow$ Additional Courses 5 credits


## Promotion and Retention

## The policy:

- To go from $11^{\text {th }}$ to $12^{\text {th }}$ grade requires at least 17 credits which must include but are not limited to:
- English
- Math

-Social Studies
- Additional Courses

## Diploma of Distinction

- Earn at least 34 Credits

4 units of English, math, science, and social studies
3 or more levels of the same world language
6 or more Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, or Dual Credit classes. Three of the six credits must be earned at the AP or IB level and must be earned in three of the four core subjects (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies).

- Cumulative GPA of 4.00 or higher
- Composite SAT score of 1100 or higher

Or

- Composite ACT score of 24 or higher
- Provide written verification of 50 hours of community service Or
- Provide verification of participation in at least one school sponsored organization during grades 10-12


## Why is Grade Point Average (GPA) important?

- Sports Eligibility: For NCAA Division 1 sports, students must maintain a 2.3 GPA.
- Scholarship Eligibility: Many scholarships, including the Life Scholarship (\$5,000 per year) require a 3.0 GPA.
- Class Rank: Class rank oftentimes factors into scholarship eligibility.
- Getting a job: Many employers look at the GPA to determine what type of work ethic you have.

## Assessments Policy

## State EOCs

- End of course exams cover the entire course.
- Seniors who are passing a course with at least an 80 average and no unexcused absences may exempt the final exam.
- Students in grades 9, 10, and 11 who are receiving high school credit for a course are not exempt from exams.
- Exams will count $20 \%$ of the final grade.
- The EOC exam schedule will be announced as soon as we have the final dates.


## Interventions

## - Test Retakes

- Depending on the course, you are eligible to retake tests if you have received a failing score.
- You must check with your teacher to determine if you are applicable to retake a test.
- Quarter Recovery
- If you receive a 50-59 in a class for the quarter you will be eligible to recover that grade to a 60 .
- Quarter Recovery assignments may include, but are not limited to:
- APEX
- Missing Assignments
- Tests/Quizzes


## Interventions

- Credit Recovery
- If you receive a final grade of a 50-59 in a class, you are permitted to recover that credit at the end of the semester or year.
- Credit recovery is offered through APEX or Virtual school.


## ARHS Dress Code

- Students are expected to follow the school dress code when attending virtual classes.
