Outside the Classroom

- Students travel to journalism conventions and film festivals to learn about their craft and improve their work. They become reporters and conduct interviews outside of school, film sports events with free entry, and attend field trips to news stations to observe real-world application.
- Media technology students have been able to secure real-world, paying film opportunities. Examples include filming hockey games at the coliseum, creating a music video for an out-of-state-band, filming weddings for a local film company, and creating promotional videos for Charleston companies.

MEDIA TECHNOLOGY CURRICULUM

The exploration of the field of communications through the study of audio and motion media industries, graphic design, computer graphics, animation and corporate communications. Classes are offered at Summerville High School.

MEDIA TECH 1

This course covers the basic knowledge required to use a video camera and camera controls with strong emphasis on compositional elements. Students will be introduced to technical and non-technical skills, including script writing, directing, and hands-on camera and studio skills such as lighting, sound, and editing.
