## Senior Citizen Privilege Card

In its twenty-eighth year, the Dorchester School District Two Senior Citizen Privilege Program is offered by the school district as a way to encourage the involvement of senior residents in the schools of our community. More importantly, this program provides the opportunity to show appreciation for the community support of our schools.

The Privilege Card entitles card holders to free admission to all school athletic events when Dorchester School District Two is the host team, with the exception of playoff games. The Privilege Card also allows free admission to most school events that are open to the public. In addition, participants will be given a 25% discount on registration fees for any adult or community education classes offered through the Dorchester County Adult Education program.

Residents age 60 or over and who live in the Dorchester School District Two attendance area may apply for a card by coming to the Dorchester District Two Administrative Offices, 102 Green Wave Blvd., in Summerville between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. By simply completing a short application and showing proof of age, applicants will be issued their Senior Citizen Privilege Card by the Public Information Office. The privilege card has no expiration date so it is valid as long as program participants live in the Dorchester School District Two attendance area.

The twenty-five schools in Dorchester School District Two invite community members to attend special events that showcase the talents of students throughout the year. Each month the Public Information Office posts a calendar of events on the district web site at **do.ddtwo.org**, under *Calendars*. Athletic schedules are also posted on individual school websites.
